Dear Friends,

With your support, 2021 was a year of change, growth, and resilience for us.

We won Connect Savannah's "Best of Savannah" award for the animal rescue category.

We were able to rent an office for adoptions, administrative work, and meet and greets.

We grew our veterinary network to include Faulkville Animal Hospital, Savannah Veterinary Clinic, Rice Hope Animal Clinic, and the Spay and Neuter Alliance. We are fortunate to have these incredible partners who provide our animals with exceptional care.

Renegade also grew our media partnerships. WSAV, KIX 96, and Connect Savannah have amplified our lifesaving efforts throughout the local community.

Local businesses have been just as instrumental to our success. Partnerships with Trophy Point Real Estate, The Rail Pub, The Hipster Hound - and countless others - have given us the financial boost to take our mission to the next level.

Speaking of money, we have diversified our fundraising to include bi-annual yard sales, a monthly donor program, and sponsored events.

Renegade also expanded Savannah's favorite event, Wag-O-Ween. In 2020 the event grew to a 2-day event and in 2021 we expanded to include the Starland district. We expect it to be even bigger this year.

Now, let's talk about the reason for everything we do - the dogs. Our mission has always been to serve our community and this year we were able to do that more than ever before. Using the Sarah Portman Community Fund we provided free spay and neuter services for family dogs and cats, reducing the number of future unexpected litters.

We couldn't do any of this without you. Hundreds of dogs have been placed in loving homes and we have been able to help prevent the continual cycle of our current overpopulation crisis by spaying and neutering.

610 ADOPTIONS

Thanks to 177 foster families, we accepted 702 dogs into our program in 2021. 610 dogs found their forever homes. We had 4 pregnant mamas give birth to 30 puppies in care.

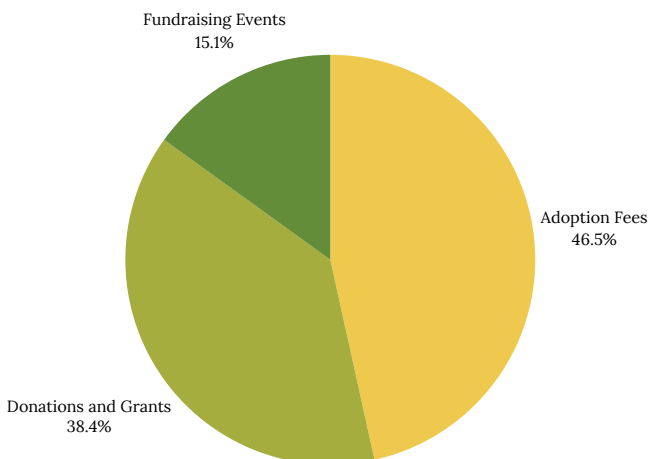
171 COMMUNITY SPAY/NEUTER

For animals in our community in 2021, we provided free spays/neuters to 171 cats and dogs. Through the Sara Portman Community Fund we also covered 4 heartworm treatments, provided basic medical care for others, and gave back to ALL rescues.

4 *Treated for Heartworm*

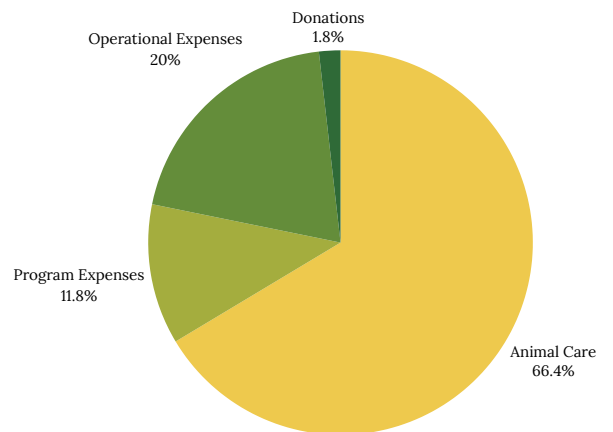
